



# **COVID-19 VACCINATION SCHEDULE FOR MODERATELY** TO SEVERELY IMMUNOCOMPROMISED PATIENTS

Includes blood cancer patients and most survivors<sup>1</sup>


If you are moderately to severely immunocompromised, you are at increased risk of severe COVID-19 illness and death. Additionally, your immune response may not be as strong as in people who are not immunocompromise, so additional vaccine doses are needed. Even after receiving all recommended vaccines, LLS encourages blood cancer patients to take additional precautions, like wearing a mask and social distancing.





while they were being treated with B-cell depleting therapies like rituximab or ocrelizumab. A patient's own oncologist is the best person to determine whether and when revaccination should happen. Moderna and Pfizer/BioNTech vaccines are strongly preferred over the Johnson & Johnson
