

Questions to Ask Your Healthcare Provider About Clinical Trials

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Asking your healthcare provider questions at any phase of your treatment will help you take an active role in managing your (or your child's) care. If you do not understand any part of the information your healthcare provider gives you, ask him or her to explain it in another way.

5. Could you suggest any clinical trials for which I (my child) might be eligible?	
	What kind of testing to monitor my (my child's) disease and treatment would be needed as part of the clinical trial?



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17. How do I find out if my insurance will cover the costs of my (my child's) treatment or the clinical trial?
18. Who can help answer any medical questions my insurance company or health plan asks?
19. Will I have to pay for any part of the trial, such as tests or the clinical trial drug(s)?
20. Will there be any travel or child care costs that I need to consider while I am (my child is) in the trial?
21. If not now, under what circumstances would a clinical trial be an option for me (my child)?
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
